

**McLennan County State Juvenile Correctional Facility  
Site Tour Policy**

**When preparing to visit our campus for your tour please keep the following information in mind.**

**1. YOU WILL NEED A PICTURE ID**

2. Everyone must clear the metal detector (this is a rather sensitive machine; jewelry, belt buckles, metal hair clips, etc. tend to set off the detector, therefore, it's best not to wear such items) Please leave purses, briefcases, cell phones, pagers, etc. in your vehicle.
3. **Clothing** – No attire that has controversial language or logos is allowed. No low cut or sleeveless attire, revealing or tight clothing, or see-through clothing is allowed. No shorts or short skirts or skirts that extend higher than 2 inches above the knee or that have slits that extend higher than 2 inches above the knee are allowed. Caps are not to be worn inside buildings and when worn outside are to have the bills facing directly forward. **No sagging pants are allowed.** Wear shoes **closed-in at the toe and no bare feet are allowed.** **Only females are allowed to wear conservative jewelry, example no loop earrings, limited necklaces.** Please dress with care. Due to the nature of the youth and their problems, requirements call for more conservative attire. Boys are expected to tuck shirts inside of pants. **No sagging pants, or Capri pants for boys are permitted.**
4. **No tobacco products, no lighters/matches**
5. **No pagers/beepers and no cell phones**
6. **No pocketknives or weapons/tools of any kind**
7. **No over-the-counter or prescription medication** (unless medically necessary to carry on your person at all times; for example, nitroglycerin pills, asthma inhaler)
8. Upon arriving at the facility report to the front lobby, you will be asked to sign in and provide a picture ID in exchange for a visitor's pass that must be worn at all times while on campus.
9. **Visitors are asked to prior to tour, to take care of necessary needs. Restroom facilities are located in the front entrance of facility.**
10. **No cameras or video equipment or recording devices are permitted on campus nor inside of the facility.**
